Homeless Youth Awareness Month

WHEREAS, the month of November is designated as National Homeless Youth Awareness Month as declared by the U. S. House and Senate in 2007 and serves as an outlet to increase public awareness of an ongoing issue occurring in every city across the United States; and

WHEREAS, the nation’s public schools report between 1.3 and 1.7 million homeless students grades pre-k through 12th grade; and

WHEREAS, we realize that when adolescents become homeless, being separated from their caregivers and homes for various reasons, which often places them in precarious situations; that school is often the most safe and stable environment for these youth; and

WHEREAS, we recognize in Henderson County that roughly 2.5 percent of our youth are identified as homeless; and

WHEREAS, Only Home WNC, Inc. is a local non-profit whose mission is to promote the value of education, honor individuality and diversity, nurture respect for self and others, and provide hope for young people in need in the community; and

WHEREAS, an effort is being made by the board members of Only Hope WNC, Inc. by hosting its 10th Annual Sleep Out on November 5 - November 6 at the Historic Courthouse on Main Street in Downtown Hendersonville in an effort to draw attention and support for youth homelessness in Henderson County.

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Hendersonville does hereby proclaim the month of November 2021 as

“Homeless Youth Awareness Month”

in the City of Hendersonville and applaud the efforts of those who serve and help fight youth homelessness in Henderson County.

Constitution Week 2021

WHEREAS, September 17, 2021, marks the two hundred and thirty fourth anniversary of the drafting of the Constitution of the United States of America by the Constitutional Convention; and

WHEREAS, The Daughters of the American Revolution (DAR) has been the foremost advocate for the awareness, promotion and celebration of Constitution Week and initiated its observance in 1955, when the organization petitioned the U.S. Congress to dedicate September 17–23 of each year to the commemoration of Constitution Week; and

WHEREAS, the United States Congress adopted the resolution, and on August 2, 1956, President Dwight D. Eisenhower signed it into Public Law #915; and

WHEREAS, it is fitting and proper to officially recognize this magnificent document and the anniversary of its creation; to encourage the study of the historical events that led to the framing of the Constitution in September 1787; and to inform people that the Constitution is the basis of America’s great heritage and the foundation of our way of life; and to emphasize U.S. citizens’ responsibility to protect, defend and preserve the Constitution; and

WHEREAS, public law 915 guarantees the issuing of a proclamation each year by the President of the United States of America to officially recognize the patriotic celebrations which will commemorate the occasion by designating September 17 through 23 as constitution week.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Barbara Volk, Mayor of the City of Hendersonville do hereby proclaim the week of September 17 through 23, 2021 to be

“Constitution Week”

in the City of Hendersonville and ask our citizens to reaffirm the ideals the Framers of the Constitution had in 1787.
